THE PRESENTERS



David S. Prescott, LICSW has worked in and around inpatient settings since 1984, and specifically with individuals who have sexually abused since 1987. He has a strong interest in sharing resources, networking, and training to increase knowledge in these fields. Mr. Prescott currently

serves as Clinical Director for the Becket Family of Services, which provide treatment for troubled youth in northern New England. Prior to his return to New England, he served as the Clinical Director at the Minnesota Sex Offender Program in Moose Lake, Minnesota and Treatment Assessment Director at the Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Center in Mauston, Wisconsin. In this position, he oversaw the progress of patients and groups of patients and coordinates an early stage of the conventional treatment track. From 1992-2004, Mr. Prescott worked as a Clinical Supervisor at Bennington School, Inc., and has been a consultant to that program ever since.

Mr. Prescott has published seven books on the assessment and treatment of people who have sexually abused, with an eighth currently in press. He has written a number articles and book chapters in these areas as well. Mr. Prescott is on the International Advisory Board for the *Journal of Sexual Aggression* and a Section Editor for the formative journal *Motivational Interviewing: Training, Research, Implementation, Practice*. He currently writes articles for the NEARI Press Newsletter, which has a monthly circulation of over 4,000.

In addition to his clinical, scholarly, and consultative work, Mr. Prescott is the current Past President of the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers (ATSA) and served as editor of that organization's newsletter, *The Forum*, from 2002-2007. Mr. Prescott is a charter member of the International Association for the Treatment of Sex Offenders and has also served on the board of directors for Stop It Now!, an organization dedicated to the prevention of sexual abuse.



Dr. Jason E. Newsome, LPC, CSOTS is the Director of Sex Offender Treatment Programs at Family Counseling Connection in Charleston, WV. He is a Licensed Professional Counselor and Certified Sex Offender Treatment Specialist from both Ohio University and

the National Association of Forensic Counselors. Dr. Newsome received his bachelor's degree from WV University Institute of Technology in 2004, his master's degree from Marshall University in 2006, and doctorate from Capella University in 2009.

In addition to his clinical work, Dr. Newsome serves on the Board of Directors for the WV Counseling Association, currently as past president and as an adjunct professor for Marshall University. Dr. Newsome has worked with the WV Supreme Court of Appeals Sex Offender Intensive Supervision Officer program since its inception in 2008. As Director of Sex Offender Treatment Programs at Family Counseling Connection, Dr. Newsome supervises six sex offender treatment programs in southern WV. In addition to supervising treatment programs, Dr. Newsome also serves as a sex offender evaluator and as an expert witness on offender-related issues in various circuits.
